



**Above:** Custom-built by DesignSpace London, this kitchen is in the penthouse of a development of luxury apartments in West London by Fusion Residential. At its heart is the spectacular central island, clad in veinmatched natural marble, giving the look of a monolithic, sculpted block. The hob is positioned on the island, making cooking

a social activity, but steam and odours are eliminated by a powerful in-ceiling extractor above. The black marble and bronze-framed breakfast bar at the end of the island forms another sculptural block. The whole kitchen is designed to face into the adjacent living space, when the doors are open between the two rooms. Furniture is from Modulnova's

Fly kitchen collection with doors cut to 45 degrees for base units. Worktops are 30mm Carrara bookmatched marble, with breakfast bar worktop in 20mm Nero Assoluto antiqued.

**Above:** This contemporary, handleless Pronorm kitchen has been installed by KPS-Pronorm of Manchester, at the Trinity Church development in Bowden, Cheshire. The development is a Grade II listed church which has been converted into nine exclusive 1-, 2- and 3-bedroom residences. The kitchens have been designed to complement the original features such as leaded windows and polychromatic brickwork that have been retained.
